4) Please describe the purpose and intent of the grant.

Part of SAFE's outreach effors include a program called "SAFE Kids." Traffic collisions are the number one killer of children and young adults in the United States. It is important to target this demographic through direct education to reduce the incidence of these traffic collisions. Partnered with the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD)'s Central Traffic Division, SAFE Kids is part of Los Angeles' efforts to reduce traffic caused fatalities to zero by 2015 as part of the LA Vision Zero Program. SAFE Kids focuses on educating elementary school children (4th and 5th graders) regarding safe pedestrian habits while empowering them to encourage their parents to use safe driving habits. It is based on the successful model created as part of Hawaii's Vision Zero Program.

SAFE Kids also ties into the strategies of the Los Angeles Department (LADOT)'s Safe Routes to School Program which is part of a nationwide initiative to encourage students cycling and walking to school by creating safe cooridors for them to travel.

The goal of the SAFE Kids project is to reduce the high number of children and young adults who are victims of traffic collisions every year. The target is to reduce severs and fatal traffic collisions with minors in the Central Traffic Division area by twenty percent over the next two years.

5) How will this grant be used to primarily support or serve a public purpose and benefit the public at-large. (Grants cannot be used as rewards or prizes for individuals)

SAFE and the LAPD will collaboratively lead an interactive pedestrian safety seminar for 4th and 5th graders. These seminars use interactive techniques to enlighten students on the risks and dangers pedestrians face by role playing safe pedestrian habits and educating on dangerous driving techniques that endanger pedestrians. At the end, students take a simple pledge to practice safe pedestrian habits and become a responsible passenger by educating their parents or other drivers on safe driving habits.

Students are then encouraged to take the pledge home and get their parents and grandparents to sign it. When they bring back the signed pledge, students will receive an LED Pedestrian Safety Light from SAFE and the LAPD to wear while walking. This allows the children to be proactive in direct education of street safety and will reach a much larger audience regarding the subject of traffic safety and dangers on our roads.

The SAFE Kids program will be rolled out to all 97 elementary schools in the Central Traffic Division of the LAPD. This could be expanded to all LA elementary schools in the following years with additional funding.

The Audubon Center at Debs Park is requesting \$500 to help raise funds for our annual holiday market, the Arroyo Seco Marketplace. The Arroyo Seco Marketplace (ASMP) is an artisan and vendor fair being held on Small Business Saturday, November 24th from 10:00am - 4:00pm. Healing Urban Barrios (HUB) provides intervention/prevention and re-entry services to youth/young adults, families and communities. HUB promotes self-love, self-worth and self-recognition through a holistic approach using case management, restorative justice, mental health, cultural awareness and education. HUB leadership and staff are deeply invested in the communities they serve because they are from those very communities.

Healing Urban Barrios aims to enhance the quality of life for youth and young adults whom are at risk of unhealthy decision making. Our programs cultivate healing and character development by incorporating strength based self- awareness, family reunification and community engagement. We stand out from other organizations because of our holistic multi-segmented approach, designed to facilitate healing while equipping individuals with crucial life skills and a foundation for character development. As a result, HUB saves lives, preserves families and restores communities.

The participants, families and communities we serve are often plagued with and coping with trauma stemming from the symptoms of economic poverty, including: gang violence, substance abuse, limited resources to address domestic violence and few opportunities to learn and practice self-care. Our communities are in need of numerous resources and support systems to assist in daily living. HUB staff utilize their grass-roots expertise and skills-set to facilitate healing and recovery processes with individuals and families in the very places where they live and work. The primary objective is to equip these community members with the necessary tools to live well and positively impact their family legacy.

Healing Urban Barrios will be providing ongoing evidence based curriculums to community members that in turn will enhance quality of life and prevent at risk behaviors. The Joven Noble Rights of Passage with Writing for Empowerment Group: This 12 week evidence based curriculum takes youth and young adults on a physical/mental and spiritual journey through self discovery and empowerment to gain self confidence and self respect. The group will further allow for youth and young adults to better understand who they are as individuals and equip them with the tools and knowledge on becoming productive members of their communities.

Parents on a Mission Group: Another evidence based curriculum that takes parents on a 6 week journey on better parenting, communication, and preventative tools to assist children grow happier and healthier. This curriculum emphasizes that parents are the corner stone to our youth and how the actions of parents also contribute to healthy communities. The program will also remind parents of the power of choice and forgiveness of themselves and their children. As a community we must uplift the parents and empower with the confidence to raise strong productive children.

Lastly, Healing Urban Barrios will be providing ongoing job readiness workshops, resume preparation drop-in center, job training and job placement assistance. Additionally, to further engage and retain community involvement, HUB will be providing community resource fairs, medical screening events (dental and medical) and community beautification projects that allow for our clients to take ownership and pride of their community.

The average cost to house an inmate in California Correction center is \$71,000 a year. The average general cost per minor in the juvenile justice ward is \$179,400 a year. The estimated savings of facilitating trainings 30 juveniles and 30 adult clients in the HUB facilitation program will save the Federal Government and State \$7,402,695.00 annually; that is a 99% financial saving in the support of Healing Urban Barrios. Providing evidence based programs to our communities greatly reduces recidivism and detention cost. As communities we must allow for such programming to be delivered on an ongoing basis to allow for growth and change in our young people and parents in need of assistance.
