Young – 3 or 4 years ago looking into it – tried to lease the space, but ended up being able to work on the building, during that time not necessarily expand proof but the business somehow, now a different time, trying to get building wrapped up

Grocery – bakery component, can't say what they're doing

Everything taking exponentially longer

Originally planning to expand – through the last 3 years – what do you need? Market – healthy fresh food

Elsy at Cedillo's office – had expressed interest/help

Ash – laundry and grocery store needed in neighborhood

Young - Cert of occupancy – change of use is nightmare – building has had cert for market, bakery, café dating back to 1925 has always been a market; la morenita had a strong presence for decades

Kept a 16-foot sign with Masa and arrow on the right side – saved large pieces of plywood

Anthea: Fire damage?

Answer: Yes, bow truss had broken and the ceiling had collapsed, salvaged old signage

Romana: La Fuente restaurant, entrance in the front and the parking lot was across the street, really nice restaurant; 80s, 99cents

Oscar: complementing local businesses – lupita's market and 99 cents store, restaurants on the other side – in terms of complementing business and how can we help support so there's not competition so much as complementation

Young – first time going through this experience – how to engage the community and what their needs are – how can they survey the community; I don't know in terms of dealing with

Anthea – interested in more diversity in terms of NGOs and

community-based orgs, is there any thought given to a subsidized space that could house a non-profit

Young- we would like to focus on that too, no experience in that non-profit world

Anthea – nascent non-profits, stakeholders trying to institutionalize

Young – part grocery and also community space, looking at different models – how can people use it as a meeting place, grocery grange hall community , info events space

Alejandra Cortez – thank you, echoing what everyone is saying, a lot of businesses opening up and worried about businesses not being open and transparent

Community space and the needs of the community; a lot of community members – NE consortium (focus on what’s happening)  
Rumors about selling alcohol

Young – don’t have a liquor permit right now, they haven’t applied for one in the works

Did add a urinal while the wall was open

Alejandra – concerned because there is a preschool, encouraged to see a building, a lot of people are doing things but they’re not all connected

Anthea – is there a group in CP?

Alejandra: El centro del pueblo, peace over violence, Unidos por nela, parent groups, would meet at el centro,

Anthea: Youth programs?

Alejandra: reaching out to create youth leadership group

Romana – we work with Alejandra, hard to give services to just one area, when El Centro del Pueblo, independent school part of LAUSD, if this is going to be a community center – parenting classes, people pick starbucks because you can have a coffee, deli & coffee with reservable room but yet be sustainable along with vending, bulletin

Oscar – preCovid what was the estimated time to open?

Tough question – hoping to be open this year, but Covid has grinded everything to a slow pace, this year is overly optimistic, next phase of making a decision

Oscar – legalizing of street vendors – legislation nitty gritty but excludes people who don't have a qualified kitchen to cook at; community kitchen to help support the vendors

Design some windows as walk-up windows so people would have a place to sell in a health dept approved kitchen  
Trying not to overthink but be mindful

**Discussion and Possible Action:**

Drive-Thru at Starbucks causing traffic issues as people line up on Figueroa. District manager notes that grab and go is newly reopened, which should help traffic and store manager instructed to keep an eye on line of cars and send out employees to encourage parking in lot. Further ideas from the community are welcome.

Romana: Opening it up to the alley – everyone trying to get in and out – use the alley to ease up congestion, not letting people turn left because that also blocks

Anthea – they built the fence, burger king had it open

Romana: limited parking – get more people to actually park – switch one of the parking to regular parking

Clint: really promote ordering ahead with app and have it delivered curbside, pass out those materials and a sign out

- Safe Streets – Cypress Park application status: DOT does not want to slow down streets with elevation changes, Ave 28 near the Metro facility, and they want us to have a larger closure area than what is left from our original plan.
  - Discussion on streets being included in revised proposal.

- Discusión y posible medida:**

Anthea – Safe Streets is a parks program, a program designed to create extra temporary recreational space  
 Not intended to be gathering areas, attend to health guidelines, ease some of the density issues, throw a football, primary goal of slow streets  
 KPCC did an article on this – ad hoc committee, creating a walking system between the various parks connecting river center to Elyria, Most streets don't qualify: have to be flat, residential, can't cross a main street  
 175 applications, only 6 implemented, based on the revisions they kicked back to us, we are able to move ahead, Anthea/Clint to reply on behalf on  
 6 streets designated that are flat and serve renters  
 Block clubs, HOAs, business, community-based orgs, it doesn't have to come from the NC, we could do another phase of this, or empower other community based orgs to do this  
 The flats – W Ave 26  
 Plazas where people can come together  
 Challenges with issues of elevation and other major streets that have to be kept open

Oscar: looking at the map, what was approved?

Anthea: list of streets approved  
Clint – once it's approved they'll give us a map, we have to do a little less outreach, Eagle Rock issue where people weren't told

Anthea – don't just want NCs applying  
How they'll evaluate the success?

Oscar – in south central org did this, moving on this very quickly, almost like a pop-up, it's ok to use streets for a different purpose, 2-3 weeks

Clint – they added on the idea of elevation being a reason is frustrating, but they won't let them close them, we're very limited, trying to get this one in and approved now but at the same time trying to push the policy for which streets are open to people, so many streets in CP are

Oscar – slow street – our committee/NC responsible for shepherding the signs, something we're doing is sending some members to do routine walks to check on the signs

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3.5. **Discussion and Possible Action:**

- City Budget allocation as it relates to Land Use, Housing, and Homeless services.
- Federal financial assistance for affordable housing, loan programs, jobs and other disaster relief. How can the community become more informed about how the city and county are spending federal money?

Oscar: uplift that “Cares Act special committee” at the city level, several hundred million dollars coming through CARES have to be spent before Dec 31 of this year, several hundreds of millions My org trying to get money to acquire properties for affordable housing, has been introduced at the city level, understand how those dollars are going to be used and how we can get them to be invested in equitable ways, DEC 31 deadline in terms of transparency, what does the council member know? CD1 on the committee.

Anthea: ask for a meeting?

Clint: as a budget advocate: what outside of CARES act, what priorities people have in this area of subject matter  
The budget for this fiscal year is still a placeholder, still some opportunities to have influence – mostly about what programs won't be funded, because hotel tax and other funding – What they'd like to see the city budget do  
Budget Advocates want to spend \$13K to advertise on city watch

Oscar: thinking about black lives matter and defund the police, reallocating funds to housing and services in areas that have experienced over policing

Clint: adopted a CIS  
People's Budget has had meeting on  
How do you translate those principles into actions in the community

Alajandra: fixing sidewalks that are not ADA compliant, street cleaning, once rainy season starts it's not sanitary

Clint: Sidewalks – more \$ for fixing sidewalks

Anthea: LAHSA – county service provided to the city, outsourced to the county

Clint: They ARE the city of los angeles, how are we

Bryan: are they

Alejandra- sending the \$ to dept of mental health and LAHSA, such a high need that is not being filled, still trying to figure out the system, LAPD has a team with social workers, LAHSA swamped already, more at a community level what are the needs?

Anthea: Mental health working with LAPD?

Alajandra: They are now. Trying to model other programs, but the challenge is that we don't want to associate mental health with LAPD, so the city is trying to figure out a new system



Bryan – E6 teams – Jose was talking about CD1 having its own E6 team which would be worth advocating for?

C: Actual budget or divert the funding?

B: still open

Anthea – staffing in the planning dept

Clint: just adopted early retirement program; the idea is that if people retire early, they'll get cash payouts now that would defer the furloughs but most of the budget advocate folks think it will not work, cash out people, do furloughs, and leave jobs unfilled

Jacqueline Beltran – family has been in CP since the 40s when it was an Italian neighborhood

Outreach coordinator for LAHSA – org that evolved out of city and county suing each other in 90s, so it has both jurisdictions

Current project: bridge home

Interested in seeing why Cedillo had not expanded bridge home to outreach in Cypress Park, advocate for more funding

MDT social worker, peer advocate, but city council push for CARE model that has more of an enforcement

We should have members of CP attend meetings and address people's

Anthea: we should have a rep?

Jacqueline: Cedillo is in charge of which communities can refer into programs, and he chose not to include, need some transparency, they were more interested in Rampart?

Jacqueline – will follow up with a link to public meeting to give feedback for how LAHSA funding is being used in the community

CD14 – SPA

Casa Zool in Westlake but the people eligible cuts off at N border at the 5 so ask Cedillo to expanding eligibility in CD1

Site has 28 beds for females, PATH for family

**PROCESO PARA RECONSIDERACIÓN:** El Consejo puede reconsiderar y enmendar su medida sobre temas listados en la agenda si la Reconsideración se presenta inmediatamente después de la acción original o en la siguiente reunión ordinaria. El Consejo, en cualquiera de estos dos días, se programará en la siguiente reunión después de la medida original; después, dos temas deberán ser establecidos en la agenda para dicha reunión (1) Una moción para Reconsideración sobre el tema descrito y (2) la proposición de una medida si la moción de reconsideración es aprobada. Una moción de reconsideración solo puede hacerse por un miembro del Consejo que haya votado previamente en el lado que prevalece de la medida original tomada. Si una moción para reconsideración no se realiza en la fecha en la que es tomada la medida, entonces el miembro del Consejo en el lado que prevalece de la medida debe presentar un memorándum a la Secretaría identificando el asunto a ser reconsiderado, junto con una breve descripción de la razón o razones de la solicitud de reconsideración en la próxima reunión ordinaria.
