Annual Día Del Niño

Since April 2018 Manos Que Sobreviven (MQS) has been an organization with the mission of offering free programs and events to low-income families in the Northeast Los Angeles area. The purpose of our events is to improving the mental and physical health of the low-income immigrant community—and ensuring that no one is discriminated in the process especially those with HIV, special needs, and/or undocumented status.

One of the events that has allowed MQS to achieve success and gain recognition from the immigrant community in Northeast Los Angeles is our annual Día del Niño (DDN). The event was created with the intention of enhancing the physical and mental health of low-income communities in the northeast Los Angeles area. Children's Day, also known as Children's Day, is a holiday widely celebrated in Mexico every April 29. For parents of Latino immigrants who immigrated to the United States to escape poverty in their homeland, the holiday still holds a certain value in their hearts and culture. Therefore, our mission at MQS is to create an event that empowers the immigrant community during this time and appreciates the traditions of their culture.

April 29, 2018 we celebrated our first Children's Day event at the Senior Center in Glassell Park. Being able to share time with all those children and families who attended that event made us dream big. After that special day, each year we celebrate all the children of our communities in Northeast Los Angeles.

Event Description

The overall purpose of (DDN) is to empower the mental and physical health of low-income and immigrant families in the NELA area. The event will be hosted on May 25 2024. At Cypress Park Recreation Center Address: 2630 Pepper Ave, Los Angeles, CA 90065

Each year we invite agencies, non-profit organizations, local schools, health departments, social media, and sponsors to participate in a single goal. Our goal of each event is to bring to our communities valuable information about free programs and services that benefit low-income families and children. Our event seeks to bring happiness, unity, love, culture, education, and solidarity. Because we believe that your group (agency) will bring essential benefits to our community that benefit their mental and physical health, we invite you to be part of this program.

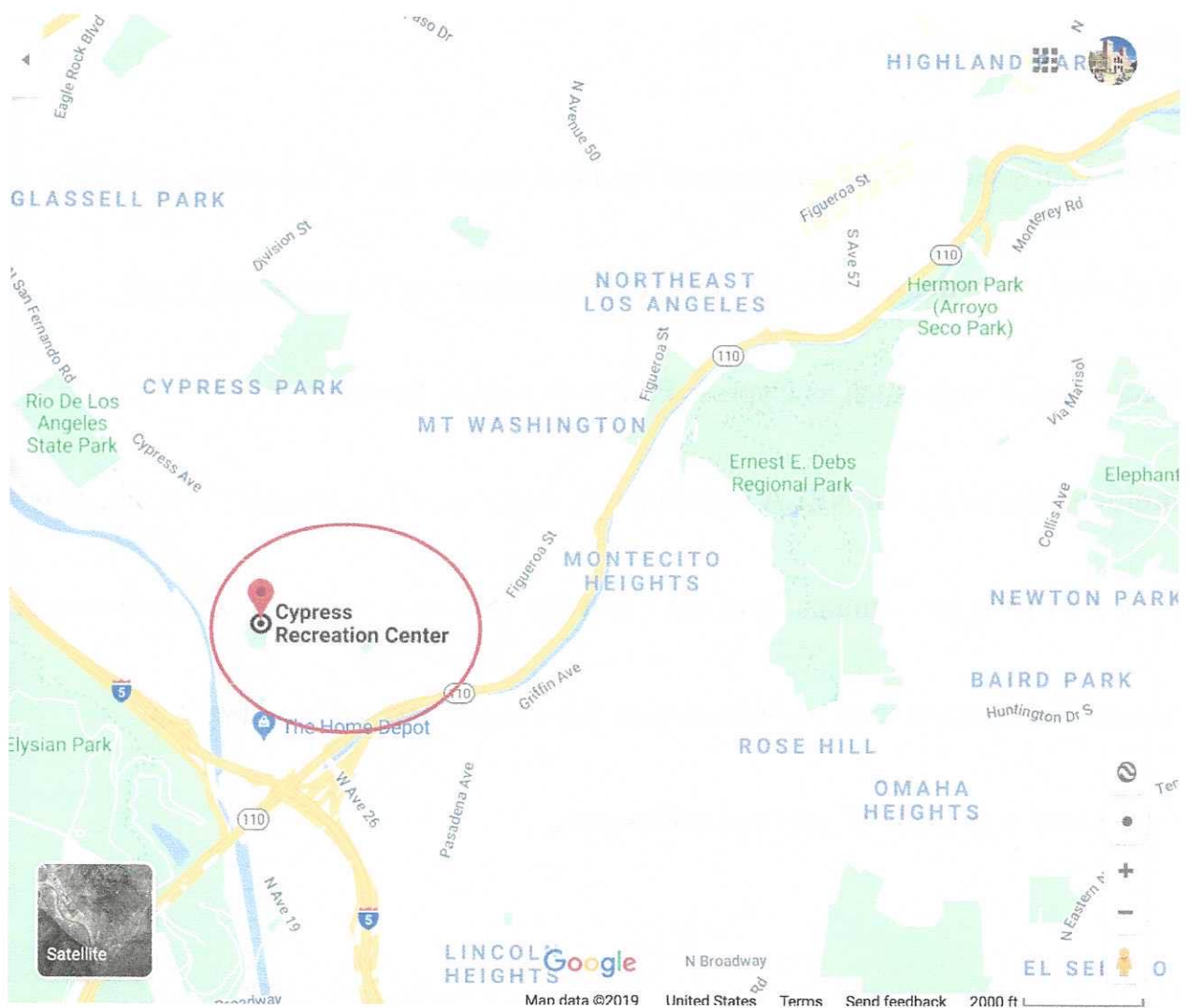
