History:

The Project will create valuable updated and fresh database on the Federally and State listed (Endangered) California Least Bell's Vireo "LBVI" (*Vireo bellii pusillus*) species and its natural critical habitat. The species was listed as Endangered in the 1980 by the CA Department of Fish and Game (CDFG), then in 1986 by the US Fish and Wildlife Services. At that time only less than 30 nesting pairs existed statewide bringing the species almost to the extinction. Since then, the species have recovered extremely slowly, mainly due to the degradation and invasion of their riparian habitat. Studies done in 1996 – 2000 showed that less than 240 nesting pairs were observed in some of the protected areas, being this the most ever recorded since 1980. Most recent studies done in 2020 claim that over 1000 species were observed in some of the protected areas, and other not protected riparian habitat areas.

Once common in the North East LA area including the Los Angeles River and its tributaries, the LBVI were no longer able to nest – raise offspring due to degradation and invasion of their critical habitat by housing, industrial and recreational development, forcing changes on the species natural behavior impacting their survival and reproductive ability, limiting efforts for the recovery of the species. There are no current or recent plans implemented in the area (NELA) to help with the recover and conservation of the Least Bell's Vireo, which makes any type of development in this area a huge threat to the recover-conservation of the species. This project will be the first ever to be implemented in the NELA area and surroundings.

Purpose and Intent of the Grant:

Funding from the NPG will support to create a community science research project to survey, study, document and disseminate the existence of the endangered Least Bell's Vireo (*Vireo bellii pusillus*) in the areas within the boundaries of the Greater Cypress Park NC for the purpose of protecting their habitats and identify the devastating effects from the cumulative impact produced by the degradation and invasion of natural critical habitat by housing, industrial and recreational development projects in environmentally sensitive critical habitat areas that are driving the species to the brink of extinction, joining Federal and State efforts to the recover-conservation of the Species.

- **Facilitate the recovery** and conservation of the Least Bell's Vireo (LBVI), an endangered bird species native to California, particularly in the Northeast Los Angeles (NELA) area.
- **Research and Data Collection:** Initiating studies on the LBVI's migratory patterns, nesting, and offspring in the NELA area to update and maintain a comprehensive database for conservation strategies. Create a comprehensive community science research initiative to garner support from Federal and State representatives in conserving the LBVI and its natural critical habitat.
- **Community Engagement and Education:** Organizing workshops, events, and

activities to foster awareness in a fun and inclusive way through art, outdoor expeditions, and other activities for children and adults such as birdwatching and surveying to encourage and promote learning about and contributing to the recovery and conservation of the Least Bell's Vireo and its habitat.

- Encourage and promote inclusivity and participation among Disadvantaged and Severely Disadvantaged Indigenous and People of Color (IPOC) communities and the general public.
- **Habitat Conservation:** Collaborating with local and federal agencies and Indigenous tribes to secure and protect extensive suitable riparian habitats to ensure the species and natural critical habitat recovery, conservation and maintenance.
- **Policy Advocacy:** Working towards the development and implementation of policies to mitigate and avoid the impacts of green-gentrification impacting the disadvantaged and severely-disadvantaged Indigenous and people of color (DSD-IPOC) living nearby, .and support the preservation of natural habitats and community heritage.
- **Sustainability and Resource Allocation:** Coordinating with federal, state and city agencies to direct resources towards the creation of biological reserves and wildlife refuges, promoting environmental sustainability and community well-being.
